

Miller, Pat. *Reaching Every Reader: Instructional Strategies in the Library for Grades K-5*. Second edition. Linworth Publishing: Columbus, OH. 2007 \$39.95 (ISBN: 1-58683-284-0.)

A resource that is for both librarians and the teachers they collaborate with, this book has something for everyone. The lessons incorporate technology along with the standards for every major content area. The book begins with a chapter on “Curriculum Integration and Collaboration” and includes sample forms and units. Chapter two looks at “Pairing Nonfiction and Fiction” and includes sources for quality nonfiction and then goes into units. “Storytelling” is next with a list of suggested props. “Technology Steps” includes some basic information on the use of technology. Chapter 5 deals with “Puppetry” and includes some great sequence pictures for the book **Bony Legs**. “Games” is next with a variety of standard games, including Jan Brett’s Book Hunt. “Drama, Music and Action” follow with a collection of activities both musical and theatrical. The book ends with “Boys and Books” with some great ways to involve boys with books.

The variety of activities adds to the book. While there is not the depth of coverage in each chapter, the book is well written and arranged for ease of use. There is a bibliography of children’s titles, professional titles and Internet sites. Includes index.
