- The Young Adult Advisory Council (YAAC) is a group of teen volunteers ages 12-18 that reviews books for the *Open Shelf* or *Branches* newsletters they produce.
- YAAC members share book reviews with other YAAC members during meetings.
- Many YAAC members also help in the library and assist with programs as needed.
- Meetings are held on Saturday mornings once or



FRANK Volunteers...

- FRANK volunteers produce *FRANK Literary Magazine*.
- *FRANK Literary Magazine* is a nonprofit annual literary magazine featuring submissions by teens and published by the City of Mesa Library.
- Teens must be ages 12-18 or in grades 7-12.
- Writers, illustrators, and editors are welcome to join FRANK Literary Magazine staff.
- Editorial staff is required to attend meetings as scheduled, read and evaluate all submissions and be prepared to make comments on them.
- Artists are needed to do artwork for the magazine
